Today I'm going to be talking about the difference between high school and college because I feel like there's a lot of major differences and I thought that I would share them with you guys. For those of you that are in high school and you want to know how college is I'm going to go ahead and share some things with you. But the first thing is that in high school, I feel like the teachers notes and stuff when they were going over them in class were really in depth and you were able to get a lot out of them compared to in college, professor's notes are so brief there's no information because they just write things down and then they talk about it instead of writing what they're talking about down. You have to be paying attention in order to get those notes down. An obvious difference is high school is usually mandatory and it is free compared to college where it's voluntary and it costs a lot of money. The next thing I have, in high school you get a lot of homework and you have a lot of stuff that's due and then I feel like in college you don't have homework that's like actual assignments for a grade. They give you homework and kind of assume and expect you to do it so that it helps with the test later on. And then in high school your time is really structured by other people or by your teachers your classes and stuff like that. In college you have to manage your own time, like you have chunks of time between classes, there's a lot of time after class. You have to manage your time well. The next thing I have is you have multiple classes in a day in high school so you go to class from like 7 in the morning to like 4 and you have like 7 or so classes depending on your high school and you go to those classes every single day whereas in college you may have 1,2,3 classes in a day and they are either Monday Wednesday or Tuesday Thursdays. Also, in high school your classes are a shorter period of time and then in college they're at least like an hour and 45 minutes. I have some classes, some studio classes in college, that are 3 hours long. You don't really look at the syllabus much in high school they'll remind you like in a week but with college it's not like that. They don't remind you they don't tell you I mean they'll tell you but like two weeks in advance "oh yeah don't forget this is due 4 Fridays from now" and just like what. So you have to constantly constantly be looking at the schedule the syllabus. The next one I have is extra credit. In high school, extra credit is usually always around. In college there is no extra credit I mean rarely and if there is it's frickin hard. Though it's rare that you have any extra credit or a way to get your grade up you just have to make good grades to begin with. Okay in high school you have to attend class like it's pretty mandatory that you have to attend class. Now this doesn't go for my college because you do have to attend class in my college, you get 2 absences. A lot of colleges don't have it like that. A lot of colleges you don't have to show up to class if you don't want to but again, you have to make sure your getting the information because if you're not you could fail that class and then you're wasting money. The next thing I have is text books are provided in high school and they are definitely not provided in college. You're looking around a few hundred dollars if you're going to school full time. Now I actually have a tip for this because I recommend that you don't buy your textbooks until around three weeks or so after classes started and the reason why I say this, and now you do have a chance that the book may not be in the bookstore anymore, the reason I'm saying this is because a lot of teachers tell you that the books are mandatory but they don't ever use them so you're wasting that few hundred bucks that you're spending. So now I always wait a few weeks after school starts and obviously if the teacher is actually using the book then you do have to purchase it. The last thing I have is that in high school you have a dress code, college that is
